

An alternative to clickers


1. In your web browser, go to www.poll Everywhere.com



2. At the top right of the screen, click "Signup". If you do not see that on your screen, click the icon with the lines in it, this will drop a menu that allows you to select "Signup".

3. Fill out the information. When finished. Click the green "Sign up" button at the bottom.

4. You will receive an email with a link to confirm your account. Then you will be ready to begin. To start a new poll, click the green "create poll" button.

5. Type your question in the box. You can watch the video, or not. When your question is typed, click "Create".

7. You can control when your polls appear by using the Push feature on the right hand side of the screen. You can create a word cloud from the responses, tweet the poll, blog, and download for Prezi. You can email yourself the results – or anyone else.
8. This is a quick way to get responses from students to check for understanding or get opinions. It is anonymous, and the free version only allows 40 responses per poll. You can have as many polls as you like, but once you have 40 responses, it will stop there. If you will have more than 40 responses to one question, then you will want to create the question more than once.
9. Applications: all content areas – fact check, check for understanding, start a debate, short answer questions. Could also be used to seek questions from students – instead of asking, “Are there any questions?” out loud, simply ask it in the poll and allow responses from them in this way.
